



## 2020/21 PE funding (actual spend)

**Total amount given = £20,000 for 2020/2021 academic year**

The five main aims for our use of the PE funding:

1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick-starting healthy active lifestyles
2. The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
5. Increased participation in competitive sport

Aims 3, 4 and 5	£1300	West Leeds Sports Partnership Service Level Agreement	<p>The PE subject leader continued to receive monthly newsletter updates from West Leeds Sports Partnership. The newsletters included information about School Games, virtual competitions, CPD opportunities and National updates. The PE subject leader attended 2 virtual subject leader days via Zoom which happened in the autumn and spring terms. The final subject leader day happened face-face in the summer term. This allowed the PE subject leader time to meet with other SLs and partnership managers to plan virtual competitions and Bramley Olympics 2021. Bramley Olympics and the Panathlon were attended by staff and children in KS2 in the summer term.</p> <p>Other support from West Leeds Sports Partnership includes:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Completion of the School Games Mark Framework 20/21 in recognition of ongoing engagement in school games.</li> <li>• Working with the subject leader to complete an Inclusive Health Check and Activity Heatmap.</li> <li>• Implementation of virtual competitions and continued work with partners e.g. Skipping School.</li> </ul>
Aims 1 and 4	£2200	Development of the provision in the school playground.	The UKS2 leader continues to ensure that lunchtimes remain physically active. During lockdown and the wider opening of school, new resources were bought for each class bubble. Lunchtime staff were made responsible for the resources and with increased physical activity, behaviour within each bubble continues to improve.

Aim 3	Complete PE £2000	Complete PE resource - Training for staff	<p>There is a clear vision which is articulated by school leaders and PE, sport and physical activity have a high profile in the school. There is strong leadership and management of PE, sport and physical activity. The PE Subject Leader is highly skilled, able to motivate staff and has the support of the Headteacher, staff, governors, pupils and parents.</p> <p>The subject leader worked closely with Complete PE to lead staff training focusing on 'Bringing Physical Education to Life' and 'Celebrating and Assessing the Whole Child'. This gave the wider staff team the opportunity to explore Complete PE, looking at suggested sequences of learning and home learning resources. Time was also spent looking at the assessment tool and the subject leader created a 'how to' guide for staff. Class teachers have been encouraged to access free CPD workshops on Complete PE.</p> <p>The confidence, knowledge and skills of staff in teaching PE, sport and physical activity have increased, this has been evidenced through staff feedback and monitoring. The wider staff team are more confident teaching PE in school. They follow an inclusive PE curriculum map which is age appropriate and sequential, consistent with national standards.</p>
Aims 1, 4 and 5	Proposed - £700  Actual - £0	Buying in specialist providers for after school clubs – Primary Sports UK Service Level Agreement	Due to COVID-19 and the use of bubbles, clubs during and after school were not able to go ahead this year.
Aims 1, 2, 4 and 5	£100	Skipping School workshop and competition programme	<p>Due to COVID-19 skipping school workshops and festivals for Year 2 and 4 did not go ahead this year. We accessed free skipping resources through the West School Sport Partnership which allowed children in Years 2 and 4 the opportunity to develop skipping skills in timetabled PE lessons, in line with the PE curriculum map. In the summer term, Year 4 accessed a free one-off skipping workshop with Skipping School.</p> <p>The school promotes skipping and each class bubble were given skipping ropes, supporting the Active 30:30 agenda. Skipping is a popular activity and children from all key stages participate in this activity.</p>

Aims 1 and 4	£2000	Resources for EYFS outdoor areas (Physical Development focus)	<p>All children are engaged and motivated, demonstrating a high level of understanding and skill in physical activities. Behaviour in the outdoor area is good and children can make decisions which challenge and inspire them even further. There has been an increase of investigational and collaborative learning in the outdoor area with children working together to develop physical skills. The new equipment and opportunities for children in reception has led to more children achieving the ELG (early Learning Goal) in Moving and Handling.</p> <p>Children show good control and co-ordination in large and small movements. They move confidently in a range of ways, safely negotiating space and they handle equipment and tools effectively. The children use equipment to build obstacle courses with wooden planks and crates. They show confidence climbing on the giant tyre and crawling through the tunnel.</p>

Aims 3, 4 and 5	£4,100	Leeds West Academy Service Level Agreement	<p>The Primary Sports Coordinator is used effectively to support teaching and learning in PE. This Primary Sports Coordinator has supported the implementation of the new PE curriculum map, in line with Complete PE, working with year groups 1-6.</p> <p>Working closely with the Primary Sports Coordinator we have taken part in virtual competitions, alongside other schools in the Bramley Cluster. The importance of personal development (physical skills, thinking skills, social skills and personal skills) are prevalent throughout PE, sport and physical activity. Pupils learn to respect and work with each other, exercise self-discipline and act in a safe and sensible manner. Aims 1, 2 and 5	£600	Supply cover for staff attending events and training	Supply organised to cover JR, SA and MH for Bramley Olympics 2021. This allowed pupils from year 6 to attend a school games competition along with other schools in the Bramley Cluster. Supply used to cover JR, SA and MH for sports day(s) 2021. Supply was used to cover JR for face-face subject leader day and time out of class in the summer term; completing the actual spend and projected spend for academic year 21-22.
Aims 1 and 4	£2200	Buying new PE resources and repairs to gym equipment	Resources for PE are appropriate and used effectively. There are well established routines and safe practice for PE with a culture of high expectations. Money has been used to replace broken equipment and enhance provision on offer. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• New equipment has been bought for dance and gymnastics following Complete PE suggested sequences of learning.</li> <li>• New athletics resources have been bought to continue to promote 'Bramley Olympics' and 'Rainbow Club' throughout school.</li> </ul> The PE team have worked together to audit physical education, physical activity and sport resources in school. Additional resources have been bought to ensure year groups can teach PE at the same time. The PE curriculum is diverse, providing pupils with the confidence to try new activities as well as enhancing their existing skills in a diverse range of environments. Pupils show exceptional levels of thinking skills, imagination and creativity and display a growth mindset.
Aim 5	£180	Transport for events	Coach hired to transport staff and children to Bramley Olympics – John Charles Centre for Sport in the summer term. 10 girls and 10 boys from Year 6 were chosen as they have missed so many events this year and did not have many more opportunities to represent our school. Following COVID-19 risk assessments, children competed against other schools in socially distanced track and field events.
