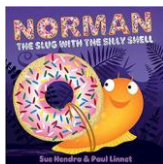
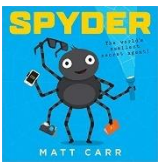

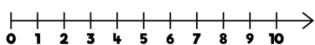

MATHS



The children will continue to learn place value within 100. This will also include, recognising tens and ones, partitioning numbers to 100, writing numbers in words to 100, comparing objects (quantities) and numbers, counting in 2s, 5s and 10s, and learning how to count in 3s.

We will then move onto addition and subtraction which will include, recapping number bonds to 10 and 20, fact families (addition and subtraction bonds within 20), adding and subtracting a three 1-digit number.



ENGLISH



Reading – we will continue to read in our small reading groups three times per week. The children will also read non-fiction texts to support them with their learning about minibeasts and their habitats. We will also continue to have our dedicated story time where the children will vote for their favourite stories, and also listen and enjoy stories chosen by adults.

Writing – There will be a balance of fiction and non-fiction writing. The children will write facts about minibeasts and their habitats, rewrite the story of Norman and the Silly Shell, write an explanation text about spy gadgets from the story Spyder, and create their very own riddles about minibeasts.

SCIENCE



Which animals live in our school grounds?

The children will explore the school grounds in search of minibeasts. They will record their findings using a tally chart. The children will also create simple food chains and explore things that are living, dead or have never been alive.

The children will learn how to care for each other and how other people care for each other. They will also listen to stories from the Bible.

- This half term we will be focusing on ball skills and dodging skills.

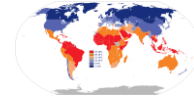


GEOGRAPHY



Where are the hot and cold places?

The children will identify hot and cold places and locate them on a map. They will also recognise the features of hot and cold places. They will identify animals that live in hot and cold places and recognise how they adapt. We will explore what we would pack for a trip to a hot and cold place and compare differences and similarities. We will finish our geography topic by writing a postcard from a hot or cold place, focusing on the weather and environment.
