Our topic this half term is: Fairy Tales **Who's afraid of the big bad wolf?**

Children will hear some traditional fairy tales such as the Three Billy Goats Gruff, the Three Little Pigs, the Enormous Turnip and the Magic Porridge Pot. We will also read the lovely story Jasper's Beanstalk and think which story it reminds us of and learn about what plants need to grow healthily. The children will be encouraged to join in with repeated refrains and anticipate key events and phrases in rhymes and stories. We will talk about settings and characters and which are our favourite.

We are looking forward to using different materials to build bridges for the three goats and homes for the three pigs.

Maths

We will continue to practise counting objects one at a time in different Areas of Learning and play games and complete activities to support the children's number recognition. We will find one more or one fewer (less) than a group of objects and teach the children how to add one more and take one away, then count all the objects altogether. We will remind the children they can line the objects up to count accurately.

We will be reinforcing the different language of size by comparing two or three objects and use the correct vocabulary such as taller, tallest, longer, longest, bigger, biggest, medium-sized, shorter, shortest, smaller, smallest etc. We will be playing in the water trays to develop this further and to include the vocabulary of capacity. We will talk about position eg put the troll under the bridge. We will describe a familiar route and talk about locations, using words like 'in front of' and 'behind'. We will also be selecting shapes appropriately: flat surfaces for building, a triangular prism for a roof, etc.

Literacy

We will continue to practise name writing and encourage children to form letters carefully and with control. We will then practise writing other letters.

We will encourage children to ascribe meanings to marks that they see in different places and give meaning to the marks that they make as they draw, write and paint.

We will listen carefully to hear and say the initial sounds in words and progress to break down words into their simple sounds for example: c-a-t and d-o-g using our robot voices.

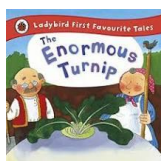
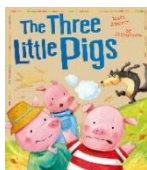
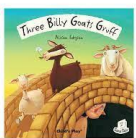
Dates to remember ...
