


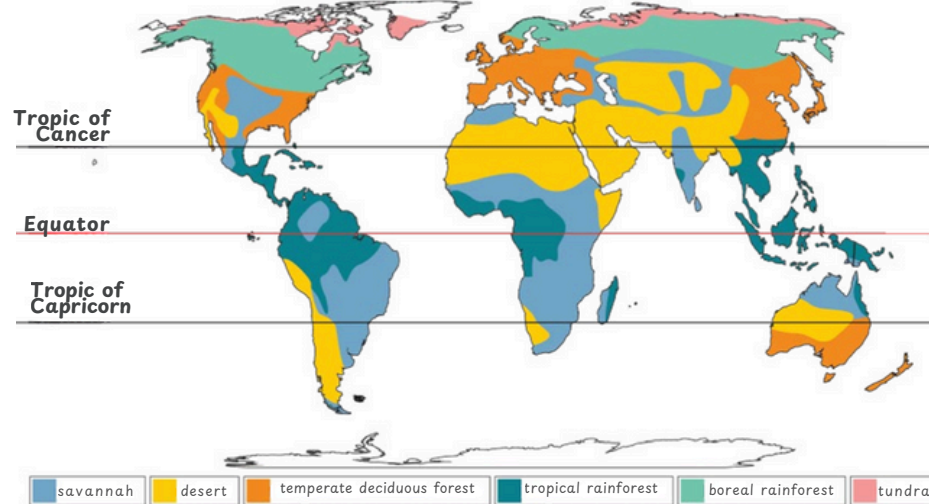
## Key Vocabulary

| <b>arid</b>             |    | Too little rain  |
| <b>barren</b>           |    | Land that cannot grow vegetation.  |
| <b>biome</b>            |    | a large area on Earth with a similar climate, landscape, and types of plants and animals |
| <b>climate</b>          |    | Long-term weather conditions in a specific region.                                       |
| <b>desert</b>           |    | Land with little to no rainfall, vegetation and wildlife.                                |
| <b>mining</b>           |    | Digging up valuable minerals.  |
| <b>rainfall</b>         |   | The amount of rain falling in a place over a particular time.                            |
| <b>renewable energy</b> |  | Energy generated from a continuous source, such as wind or water.                        |

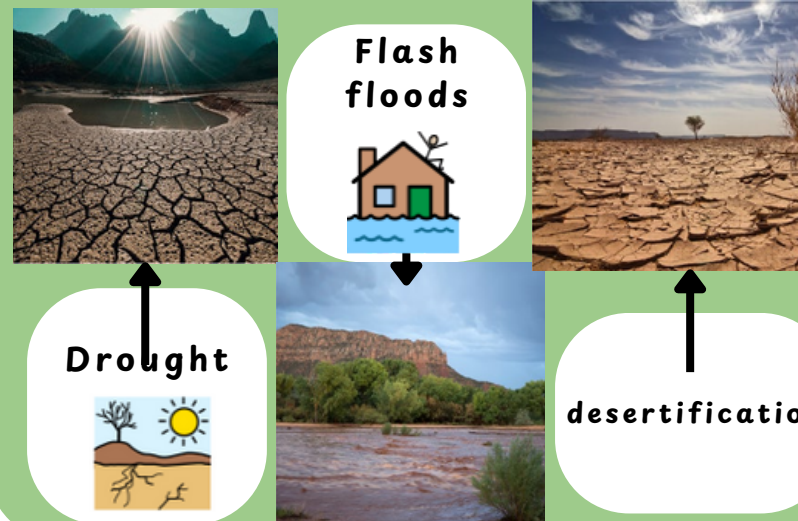
